ALA's COUPON CLIPPING PROGRAM TO BENEFIT MILITARY FAMILIES STATIONED OVERSEAS.

WHAT KIND OF COUPONS? Any manufacturer's coupons that you would clip from your local newspaper or magazines which you do not plan to use yourself

EXCEPT: Those which can only be used in U.S. stores (e.g., not TARGET, McDonald's, or those specified for use only in a specific grocery chain or drug store).

If you wish to exclude products we understand are not honored by the commissaries - a list is included. However, the list was generated a few years ago by the commissary that no longer accepts coupon shipments and may be outdated. We exclude them from our program because we don't want to send something that may not be useful.

WHAT ABOUT EXPIRATION DATES? Coupons can be used (in overseas commissaries only) up to six months past the expiration date. However, we exclude any that are over 3 months past the date to allow for shipping and handling delays.

MUST THEY BE CLIPPED? Yes. The commissaries do not have staff to clip them and the extra paper involved will increase your cost of mailing dramatically.

KEEPING TRACK: Bring those coupons to the Auxiliary meetings, the 2nd Thursday of each month starting at 7:00pm, so we can send them in.


